Sunday/Holiday Schedule

SacRT bus and light rail service will operate on a Sunday/holiday schedule in observance of New Year's Day, Saturday, January 1, 2022, and on Martin Luther King Jr. Day on Monday. January 17, 2022. Folsom Stage Line buses, SmaRT Ride, Rancho CordoVan, Elk Grove Transit and Causeway Connection do not operate on these days.

January 2022 Service Changes

Effective Monday, January 3, 2022, Folsom Stage Line bus route 20 will have minor shifts to the afternoon trips. Visit sacrt.com/schedules for details.

Scheduled Blue Line Service Disruptions in January

The North 12th Complete Streets project construction is planned for Tuesday, January 18 through Friday, January 21, 2022, and again on Monday, January 24 through Friday, January 28, 2022. As a result, light rail service will be temporarily disrupted on the Blue Line (north area only) starting from 7 p.m. through the end of the service day during construction. Special SacRT shuttle buses will transport passengers between the Cathedral Square (10th & K and 11th & K) and Marconi/Arcade light rail stations during the disruption. Ride Free on the SacRT Holiday Bus

SacRT wishes everyone a Happy New Year and reminds you that you can still ride the SacRT Holiday Bus for free on Saturday, January 1, 2022 (bus route 1) and Sunday, January 2, 2022 (bus routes 86 and 87). The ride is free; however, passengers have the opportunity to deposit a cash donation in the farebox or donate online to Civic Thread, formerly known as WalkSacramento.

Watt/I-80 Elevator Repairs Scheduled for **Completion this Month**

The installation of the new elevators at the Watt/I-80 light rail station will continue throughout the month of January. Weather has impacted the progress to some extent; however, contractors expect to have the work completed by the end of the month. During installation, contractors will need to close the east side of the station elevator and stairs. During construction, passengers will need to board a special shuttle bus to access the Watt/I-80 light rail station from Watt Avenue. Check the sacrt.com/alerts page for updates.

Free Rides to COVID-19 Vaccination Sites Extended

SacRT has extended free transit rides to scheduled COVID-19 vaccine appointments, including boosters, through Thursday, March 31, 2022.

To ride free, you only need to show a COVID-19 vaccine appointment confirmation in the form of an email, text or vaccine card, which will serve as valid fare only on the date noted in your appointment confirmation to ride SacRT's fixed-route bus, light rail, Elk Grove Transit, Folsom Stage Line, SmaRT Ride or SacRT GO Paratransit Services. Please note free rides are not available for SacRT's contracted services (Rancho CordoVan).

When boarding a bus, show the operator either a printout or screenshot on a smartphone, or have ready to show a fare inspector when riding light rail.

Federal Mask Mandate Extended

The federal mandate to wear a mask when waiting, boarding or traveling on public transportation has been extended through Friday, March 18, 2022. Whether vaccinated or not, passengers must wear a mask that covers both the nose and mouth. Masks are available for free at SacRT's Customer Service and Sales Center located at 1225 R Street (13th Street light rail station). To request a reasonable modification of this mandate, call 916-321-BUSS (2877).

As a reminder, riders should avoid public transit if sick, positive for COVID-19, or if they think or know they have been exposed to COVID-19. Visit sacrt.com/covid19 to learn more.

SacRT on the Move, Short-Range Transit Plan Next Steps

SacRT on the Move is SacRT's Short-Range Transit Plan (SRTP) that considers things such as span and frequency improvements, pandemic recovery, and ridership building initiatives over the next five years.

SacRT greatly appreciates all the community involvement and stakeholder coordination that has taken place throughout the fall season, and continues to seek feedback from the public to build a SRTP that best serves the region. Preparation of the draft SRTP document will continue through the winter months and will be shared with the SacRT Board of Directors and members of the public in February 2022.
