Two new bus routes to debut in April 2020, Route 138 Causeway Connection and Route 128 Sunrise Express

Pre-Paid Ticket & Pass Exchange Starts April 1

Effective July 1, 2020, SacRT buses and light rail fare vending machines will no longer accept pre-paid ticket and passes with a June 30, 2020 expiration date. The ticket and pass exchange will start on Wednesday, April 1, 2020, in order to provide better customer service, shorter wait times and ample opportunity for staff to answer questions about the transition to Connect Card and ZipPass fare. Transferring the value on to electronic fare media eliminates the need for future paper ticket and pass exchanges.

Customers can exchange their pre-paid tickets and passes at the SacRT Customer Service and Sales Center located at 1225 R Street (adjacent to the 13th Street Station). The last day to exchange pre-paid tickets and passes is on Monday, August 31, 2020.

The Customer Service and Sales Center is open Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. Visit sacrt.com for details.

April 2020 Service Changes

Effective, Sunday, April 5, 2020, SacRT will implement the following service changes:

Route 11: Natomas/Land Park (Monday through Friday)

To improve on-time performance, all trip times will be adjusted.

Route 21: Sunrise (Monday through Friday)

A new trip will leave Sunrise Mall Transit Center at 5:40 a.m. and arrive at the Mather Field/Mills light rail station at 6:11 a.m.

Route 23: El Camino (Monday through Friday)

To improve on-time performance and connections at the Arden Del Paso light rail station, time will be added to the morning peak schedule.

Route 30: J Street (Saturday)

Saturday service frequency will increase from every 60 minutes to every 30 minutes all day.

Route 51X: Downtown Shuttle/Broadway/-Golden 1 Center

Route 51X will only operate on days there is an event at the Golden 1 Center. Regular Monday through Friday service will be canceled.

Route 56: Meadowview (Monday through Friday)

To improve on-time performance, time will be added to the schedule in both directions.

Route 75: Mather (7 days a week)

Route 75 will be separated into two routes serving the same area as the current Route 75. The new Route 75 will operate east of the Mather Field/Mills light rail station. The new Route 78 will operate on the portion of the current Route 75 that operates between Butterfield and Mather Field/Mills light rail stations.

Route 78: Butterfield (7 days a week)

This new route will serve the portion of the current Route 75 that operates between Butterfield and Mather Field/Mills light rail stations.

Route 93: Hillsdale (7 days a week)

This route will be re-routed between Roseville Road and Andrea Boulevard to serve Diablo Drive instead of Tupelo Drive.

Route 128: Sunrise Express (Monday through Friday)

Effective Monday, April 27, the new Route 128 Sunrise Express will provide peak only service between Orangevale, Fair Oaks, the Sunrise light rail station and Rancho Cordova, ending at the Mather Field/Mills light rail station.

Route 138: Causeway Connection (Monday through Friday)

The new Route 138 Causeway Connection will provide weekday service between the UC Davis campus and the UC Davis Medical Center.

Causeway Connection to Debut April 6

On Monday, April 6, 2020, the new Route 138 Causeway Connection zero emission electric bus service between Davis and Sacramento will begin operation. SacRT and Yolobus will operate the service in partnership with UC Davis, City of Sacramento, Electrify America and the Sacramento Area Council of Governments to operate the new public intercity express bus service.

The Route 138 Causeway Connection bus will operate Monday through Friday between the hours of 5:30 a.m. and 8:50 p.m. between the cities of Davis and Sacramento.

The service will operate, in tandem, by SacRT and Yolobus. Each transit agency will operate six of the 12 electric buses. More information is available at causewayconnection.com.
