Drive the Vote

SacRT has teamed up with Sacramento County and the Sacramento Kings to drive community members to Vote Center and Ballot Drop Box locations across the Sacramento region, including Golden 1 Center to help Drive the Vote.

SacRT is offering free rides system-wide on all bus, light rail, SmaRT Ride and SacRT GO services in celebration of Election Day on Tuesday, November 3. No flyer or exemption code necessary to ride free.

The Sacramento Kings-led “Rally the Vote” is a nonpartisan coalition of over 50 professional sports teams across the country committed to encouraging fans to register to vote and participate in elections. To help increase accessibility, Golden 1 Center in Downtown Commons is the largest Vote Center in Sacramento County and is open through Tuesday, November 3. SmaRT Ride Offers Free Rides Through November 2

SacRT is offering free rides on SmaRT Ride microtransit shuttles in all nine service zones through Monday, November 2 with the exception of the weekend (no Saturday or Sunday SmaRT Ride service). Learn more about SmaRT Ride at sacrt.com/smartride.

To ride SmaRT Ride free, simply print or take a screenshot of the side of the SmaRT Ride free ride flyer with the QR code. You only need one flyer per group of riders traveling together. Have it ready to show the bus operator when boarding the shuttle. As a reminder, riders and SacRT employees are required to wear a mask or face covering.

Ride Free on the SacRT Holiday Bus

SacRT will once again wish everyone a happy holiday season by offering free rides on its annual holiday bus. The holiday-themed 40-foot bus will be easy to spot as it travels on different routes throughout the Sacramento region spreading goodwill from Tuesday, December 1, 2020 through Friday, January 1, 2021.

In keeping with the “season of giving,” passengers will have the opportunity to deposit a cash donation in the farebox. This year, all donations will benefit the Food Literacy Center.

Food Literacy Center's mission is to inspire kids to eat their vegetables. They teach children in low-income elementary schools cooking, nutrition, gardening, and active play to improve their health, environment, and economy. Did you know that only 4% of kids eat enough veggies and 1 in 3 have type 2 diabetes? Healthy eating is the most effective way to prevent diet-related disease. During the pandemic, Food Literacy Center is distributing Veggie Recipe Kits to kids so they can cook a healthy meal at home with their families. AmeriCorps Volunteers to Hand Out Masks at SacRT Light Rail Stations

SacRT has partnered with AmeriCorps Sacramento volunteers to make sure everyone who needs a mask gets one. Volunteers will be located at various light rail stations and transit centers for the next eight weeks handing out masks and information about upcoming SacRT events.

RydeFreeRT Isn't Just for Trips to School

Even if your student isn't attending school in person, they can still take advantage of the SacRT RydeFreeRT program, which has been extended through September 30, 2021.

Students and youth in grades TK through 12th can ride SacRT fare-free with a student ID or RydeFreeRT card. It's not just for school. Ride SacRT buses and light rail trains any time, anywhere during regular service hours.

Due to distribution limitations resulting from COVID-19, all a student needs to ride for free is a student ID card or a RydeFreeRT card. No sticker is required to ride. As schools re-open, stickers and cards will also be available at most school locations.

Youth who are experiencing homelessness or taking part in foster programs are also allowed to participate in the program, regardless of current residence or school address. For students and youth who need a replacement card, don't have a student ID, or that do not have a student ID or RydeFreeRT card, they can visit SacRT's Customer Service and Sales Center located at 1225 R Street (adjacent to the 13th Street Station).
