RT seeks public input for light-rail line to airport

The **Sacramento Regional Transit District** is set to host two open houses meant to inform people about a draft environmental study of a planned 13-mile light-rail extension between downtown Sacramento and **Sacramento International Airport**.

With 14 stations, the future Downtown-Natomas-Airport light-rail route would serve the future Railyards development, the Richards Boulevard redevelopment area, and the South and North Natomas communities.

The first open house is scheduled for Saturday from 10 a.m. to noon at the Inderkum High School Theatre, 2500 New Market Drive. The second is from 5:30 to 7:30 p.m. Feb. 11 at the Continental Plaza Auditorium, 601 N. Seventh St.

People who attend the events will have a chance to view project displays, talk with team members and hear a brief presentation.

The environmental report describes the significant components of the project, a basis for understanding the project's environmental effects, and identifies the means to avoid or minimize those effects. The full report is available for review at **www.dnart.org**. A public comment period ends Feb. 26.
