

**SACRAMENTO REGIONAL TRANSIT DISTRICT  
13<sup>th</sup> AND 16<sup>TH</sup> STREET LIGHT RAIL STATION IMPROVEMENT PROJECT  
MITIGATION MONITORING AND REPORTING PLAN**

The California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) requires that a lead agency establish a program to report on and monitor measures adopted as part of the environmental review process to mitigate or avoid significant effects on the environment. This Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Plan (MMRP) is designed to ensure that the mitigation measures identified in the 13<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup> Street Light Rail Station Improvement Project Mitigated Negative Declaration (MND) are implemented. The MMRP conforms to the requirements of Public Resources Code Section 21081.6 and State CEQA Guidelines Section 15097.

As outlined in the following table, the MMRP describes monitoring actions, schedules, and responsibilities for all mitigation measures identified in the MND. The table is organized by topic in the same order as the contents of the MND. Less-than-significant impacts are omitted, however, because they do not require mitigation. The components of the table are explained briefly below.

**Mitigation Measure.** The attached table summarizes the mitigation measures for the impacts identified in the MND. The measures are given the same numbers as in the MND.

**Mitigation and Monitoring Responsibility.** The table identifies the primary party or parties responsible for undertaking each measure. In most cases, the primary responsibility for implementing the mitigation measures has been assigned to Sacramento Regional Transit District (referred to as the Project Sponsor).

**Monitoring Action.** The table identifies the specific actions that must be completed for a mitigation measure to be considered implemented. Monitoring actions are discrete steps that can be documented and reported.

**Schedule.** The table states when each monitoring action is to take place. Depending on the measure (and the nature of the impact to be mitigated), the schedule for implementing a specific monitoring action ranges from “prior to receiving project approvals” to ongoing actions that must take place on a regular and defined basis.
