Anyone can ride SacRT for free between Saturday, October 1 and Friday, October 7, 2022.

Bus Stop Closure Through December 2024

Due to construction at 1600 9th Street, the bus stop at 8th Street and Q Street (bus stop #324) will be unavailable through December 2024. Routes serving this stop include 11, 51, 102, 103, 134 and Elk Grove transit service.

The renowned event includes a 2.4-mile swim, a 112-mile bike ride and a 26.2-mile marathon that will race through the streets between West Sacramento and downtown Sacramento.
