EXTENSION TO SUNRISE STATION FACT SHEET

The Sacramento Regional Transit District's 2.8-mile extension to Sunrise Boulevard spans primarily through the new city of Rancho Cordova, incorporated in July 2003. It is part of the 10.75-mile Sacramento Amtrak to Folsom Light Rail Extension slated for completion in October 2005.

The extension to Sunrise adds three new light rail stations to the system, two within the City of Rancho Cordova. The Zinfandel and Cordova Town Center light rail stations are both located within walking distance of schools, parks, retail shopping centers, residential areas and office complexes.

A majority of the work on the \$89 million construction project was performed by union labor and created approximately 2,111 jobs.
